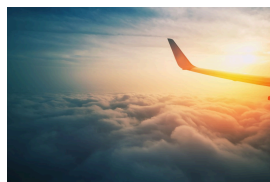

We are excited to continue our work, using the successes of certificate pilot purchases as a launching pad towards replicable, scalable models. Taking stock of 2024, we can see the growing momentum through the Principles and Best Practices publication, sharing the power of book and claim at multiple live sessions throughout the fall,



increasing collaboration across the registry landscape towards interoperability, and digging into the emerging road book and claim market. While this is progress, we acknowledge that much work remains in maximizing the book and claim opportunity in decarbonizing heavy transport.

Capacity Building: Inventory "PEP-talk"!

This month's capacity-building is a pep-talk. We encourage you to get your hands dirty and learn, even at the end of this year! We know that book and claim unlocks difficult or impossible decarbonization in your transportation system—available for you to retire and include in this year's inventory or working towards using in your next year of operations.

We encourage you to get one step closer before the end of *this* reporting year. It's still possible.

You could partner with a carrier or initiate an internal leadership conversation. If you haven't had an introductory conversation with a registry, carrier, or fuel provider, we invite you to better understand how you use their book and claim tools to secure low emission transportation attributes.

When considering action today (or tomorrow), give yourself and any colleagues or managers a similar pep talk!

1. Yes, the future status of GHGp and SBTi are, *under construction*, and talking about twenty twenty-six sounds hard. However, we see great things coming from these processes and are optimistic! Meanwhile, if they see more quality activity, there is a greater chance they can develop quality rules.
2. We know that uptake of high-quality book and claim activities drive *real* decarbonization. Lower carbon intensity transport = fewer emissions... it's



science and math.

3. Reported booked and claimed activity is increasing! Book and claim inventory inclusion is increasing in other industries too—power sector continues to mature, and use in others like agriculture, steel, concrete are growing.

“There is already a practice of reporting on emissions from book and claim, and despite the lack of formal acknowledgement, it is already possible. All of these examples we’ve seen have undergone verification... showing that reporting on this is already possible.” ([LINK to VIDEO](#))
